**College Activities:**

■ The college teachers' unit felicitated the principal Dr. Mrigen Das on his being conferred the Ph.D degree by Gauhati University. His area of research was Ethnobotany, where he worked on how the Garo people make use of indigenous plants.

■ A day long meeting of principals of different colleges of the western part (both north and south bank of the River Brahmaputra) of Assam was held on 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2009 in Birjhora Mahavidyalaya premises, under the aegis of Assam College Principal's Council. Dr. Mrigen Das, Principal of Birjhora Mahavidyalaya (Host Institution), while welcoming the distinguished principals, also offered thanks and gratitude for their stepping into this college. Dr. A. Talukdar, Vice President, Dr. B.K. Das, General Secretary, Dr. Hitesh Deka, organizing secretary of the ACPC attended the meeting to learn the problems facing by the college Principals in managing their institutions particularly in the matters related to permission, affiliation, examination, Govt. concurrence, non allotment of sanctioned posts of both teaching and non teaching, Arrear dues, service rule etc. Most of the Principals of the colleges of erstwhile Goalpara district attended the meet.

■ In a meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> June 2009, the college teachers' unit felicitated Dr Neelanjana Barua of the Department of botany on her being conferred the Ph.d degree by Gauhati University. Dr Neelanjana Barua gave a talk explaining the nature and importance of her work on reversal of reproductive characters in *Cucumis sativas L* and *Sechium Edule L* by the application of plant growth regulators.

■ Dr. A. Rahmani, Director B.N.H.S visited the college on 23<sup>rd</sup> June, 2009 and gave a talk on the importance of ecotourism with special reference to bird tourism and the

environmental, social and economic consequences of it. He asserted that the rich biodiversity of the North –East makes it a natural spot for promoting ecotourism in this region. At the end of the talk there was a lively interactive session where Dr Rahmani answered all the queries addressed to him by the students. During the talk, the principal Dr Mrigen Das released a special issue of MISNET, the official newsletter of Bombay Natural history Society. Dr Rahmani also presented a copy of his latest book “**Ducks, Geese and Swans of India—Their status and distribution**” to the college library.



■ In keeping with the “**International year of Astronomy**” a seminar on total solar eclipse was arranged by the Dept of Physics in collaboration with Pragjyotish Amateur Astronomers association, Gauhati on 27<sup>th</sup> June, 2009. This was the first day of college for the newly admitted B.Sc 1<sup>st</sup> year students. Before the start of the talk, the principal Dr. Mrigen Das addressed the new students and welcomed them into the college family. Dr K. K. Sarma, H.O.D Physics explained the importance of the year 2009 declared as the International year of Astronomy and spoke about the evolution of telescopes. Sri Chakradhar Das, lecturer Bongaigaon Polytechnic gave a talk elucidating the reasons why solar eclipses occur and the appropriate conditions required. Sri M. Das, H.O.D Deptt. of Mathematics then gave a power point presentation titled “**Predicting eclipses**”. He described the mathematical principles involved when eclipses occur.

In continuation of the above programme a team of members of the teaching staff, students from different institutions, NGOs and a press team gathered to view the phases of the total solar eclipse on 22<sup>nd</sup> July, 2009. Though bad weather prevented the gathering from a clear viewing of the phases, total darkness was experienced. Behavior of the animals and plants of the locality during this period was studied.

■ On the occasion of “**Breast Feeding Week**” two well known pediatricians of Bongaigaon Dr. P. Deka and Dr I Bordoloi addressed a gathering of students to make them aware of the necessity and importance of breastfeeding.

■ The freshmen social was celebrated on 25<sup>th</sup> of August, 2009. Our Principal Dr. M. Das welcomed the newly admitted students giving a brief insight into the history of the college. Members of the teaching staff and senior students also welcomed the freshers with inspirational speeches and useful suggestions. The freshers then personally introduced themselves to the gathering. This was followed by refreshments and a cultural program.



■ On 28<sup>th</sup> August, 2009 a team of medical experts from Brahma Kumaris Ishwariya Vishwa-Vidyalyaya, Mount Abu paid a visit to the college as a part of their campaign **My India, Healthy India**. Organised by the medical wing of the Brahma Kumaris, they held a talk at the college for creating awareness for total health and eradication of

all negative habits that are creating diseases in the society.



■ The college foundation day was observed on 1<sup>st</sup> September, 2009. After the ceremonial unfurling of the college flag by the principal, he delivered a short speech explaining the importance of the day. This was followed by a visit to the sacred grove in Mahadev Hill behind the college. Lamps were lit, prayers offered and prasad distributed among the staff and students present.

■ Teacher’s day on the 5<sup>th</sup> September, 2009 was celebrated in the college in a grand manner. The students of Birjhora Mahavidyalaya organized a colourful programme on this occasion.



The program included a cake cutting ceremony, short speeches on the importance of the day, and cultural items. Taking a break from their regular classroom lectures the teachers took to the stage to sing a chorus and also perform individually. An enjoyable time was had by all present.

He gave a seminar talk on —"Global Warming, CO<sub>2</sub> and Research Needs".
